State Watch

National Advance For PA Practice

This isn't a specific state watch - but is instead a national advance for PA Practice.

If you work in an environment that treats federal employees - check this out:

The U.S. House of Representatives' approved legislation (H.R. 2465, the Federal Workers' Compensation Modernization and Improvement Act.) that would allow PAs to

diagnose and treat federal employees with job-related traumatic injuries.

The bill amends the Federal Employees Compensation Act (FECA) to allow PAs to diagnose and treat federal employees with job-related traumatic injuries, an estimated 85 percent of all federal workers' compensation cases. The bill was approved by the House Education and Workforce Committee in July and passed without objection by the House, and must now pass the Senate to become law.

This is the first significant reform of FECA in over 40 years. Contact your local Senator to encourage them to take action on this bill in Congress.

Gimme The \$\$\$

Are you using Modifier 24? Do you bill for globals?

This is one of the top 10 billing errors seen on RAC (Recovery Audit Contractor) audits. If you are submitting a claim for a service using modifier 24 and that service should have been included in the global package, you could be fraudulently billing.

Recently, CMS announced they are conducting a three-year demonstration to expand prepayment review of Medicare claims. The Recovery Audit Program Prepayment Review demonstration will allow Medicare Recovery Auditors to conduct prepayment claim reviews to assist in lowering the improper payment rate and to identify potential fraud and abuse.

This demonstration will be conducted for 3 years, from January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2014. It will be implemented in 11 states, and NC is one of them.
